Parish Council meeting of Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2016 at 8.00pm, Village Hall, Pye Corner, Gilston. **PRESENT**: Cllrs Beazley, Geddes, Hughes, Orson, Olsen, Christine Law (Parish Clerk), Roger Beeching (County Councillor), Michael Beard (PHE- Harlow), 2 member of the public.

# PRESENTATION RECEIVED FROM MICHAEL BEARD OF PUBLIC HEALTH ENGLAND – HARLOW

Michael was welcomed to our meeting and he informed us that the old GSK site in Harlow is going to be the new site for Public Health England. They are in the process of consulting with all stake holders on their plans - they want to be good neighbours and open and transparent. The consultation process is taking place before planning applications are submitted for the site hopefully in May 2018. The site will be partially redeveloped and there will be new buildings. Public Health England will be major employers using local support services and will have a significant positive impact on the local economy.

One public exhibition of their plans has already been held and another is scheduled for 6-8 October at the Leisure Zone, Harlow – Science Alive where everyone is welcome to look at their plans and talk to the Public Health England representatives.

Cllr Orson thanked Michael for his very informative presentation.

#### **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

- 1. Highways at our last meeting a resident of Pye Corner complained about the lack of traffic speed and weight restriction enforcement through the village and has since written to Cllr Orson with a petition from residents and covering letter. The petition and letter has been forwarded to Paul Patmore our HCC Highways Locality Officer and Cllr Beeching for their response. Cllr Beeching requested a printed copies so that he could formally accept the documents.
- 2. War Memorials It was asked if the steps leading to Gilston War Memorial and the surround could be cleaned before Remembrance Sunday. Clerk will speak to contractor on this matter.
- 3. Hedgerows along Gilston Lane are in need to being cut back. Cllr Orson will speak to Knight Frank on the matter as the majority of these are their responsibility.

#### 37. STOP HARLOW CAMPAIGN

a. Cllr Hughes reported that he has had a meeting with Mark Prisk MP who is still opposed to the development. A newsletter will be delivered shortly.

#### 39. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

a. Cllr Orson reported that regular meetings are taking place with the leader of East Herts Council and the Chief Executive to discuss the District Plan and that the next meeting will be held on 29 September. The meetings so far have covered the planning process and clarification of East Herts Council's proposals. The District Plan should be approved on 22 September and will be published on 3rd November coinciding with the publication of plans for Harlow, Uttlesford and Epping. There will then be a period up to 15 December for East Herts Council to receive comments from residents and all interested parties that will be submitted in March 2017 to the Planning Inspectorate for Examination with the District Plan. The parish council has started to formulate a response to the District Plan working with the Neighbourhood Plan Group and will be meeting next on 4 October. We have needed clarity on the District Plan to progress our Neighbourhood Plan that must fit with this.

#### 40. HIGHWAYS

a. Cllr Beazley is organising a meeting with Ringway, the contractors used by HCC to carry out the Highways maintenance programme, to review the status of Highways maintenance work in our parish. There are some items outside our parish boundaries that affect residents and will be investigated separately - the damaged white railings over the brook in Burnt Mill Lane that are on the border with Harlow and roofing materials dumped in Redricks Lane. Clerk will seek out map identifying parish boundaries.

#### HERTFORDSHIRE HIGHWAYS

Hertfordshire County Council's contractor, Ringway, have been cutting back vegetation around road signs and to improve visibility at junctions and blind corners as part of our countywide spruce-up campaign. Householders and landowners are being reminded that they are responsible for cutting back vegetation that has overgrown from their property onto the public highway.

Terry Douris, Cabinet Member for Highways, said: "It's really important that roadside vegetation is not a danger to road users and pedestrians. Also, our pavements and footpaths are vital routes around villages and towns and are used by many people in our community; parents with pushchairs, cyclists, horse riders as well as older people with impaired vision and mobility aids such as walking sticks and scooters.

"That's why we are calling on residents and landowners to please check their hedges alongside roads and footways and where necessary, cut back to ensure that Hertfordshire's highways are clear for everyone to enjoy," added Terry.

Hertfordshire County Council has a legal duty to protect the rights of the public to use the highway, and this includes requiring residents to remove obstructing vegetation. The council may contact land owners where a problem has been identified and give notice to remove the obstruction or risk incurring a cost for its removal.

As we get deeper into the autumn, November brings us to the time of Remembrance. November 1916 saw the closing stages of the Battle of the Somme where over one million men were killed or injured, the bloodiest battle in human history. We will be remembering them and all who have died in the Great War and conflicts since on Remembrance Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November by holding ceremonies at each of the War Memorials in the benefice, at High Wych, Pye Corner and Eastwick. These will start at 10.45 am and all are very welcome to join us.

November ends on a happier note with Advent Sunday on 27<sup>th</sup>. This is the beginning of the new Christian Year and starts the run up to Christmas. As well as being a time of preparations for the forthcoming festivities, for Christians, Advent is also a time for sombre reflection. The word "advent" simply means coming and, of course, we are looking forward to celebrating the coming of Jesus as the baby of Bethlehem. The bible also speaks of a Second Coming when Jesus will return to earth as a judge to wrap up the present order and establish God's rule on earth for eternity. Some Christians still take this literally. For me it symbolically expresses the belief that, however it happens, we will all on day have to give an account of ourselves to God and be rewarded accordingly. Advent is a time for preparing for that event, in this life or the next.

So as we buy the presents, arrange the family parties and go hunting turkeys, let us all give a thought to whether we really are ready to meet Jesus in person.

#### THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

.

The Society held its annual general meeting in September at the Forge Museum, Much Hadham. The formal business was preceded by a most interesting guided stroll around Much Hadham, led by museum curator Cristina Harrison. There is much to see all along the High Street and inside the church. Much Hadham became an important place almost a thousand years ago when the first palace was built here for the Bishop of London. It was used by the bishops for hundreds of years and Edmund Tudor was born there in 1430. His son became King Henry VII in 1485, the first of the Tudor dynasty. The current palace, dating from the 16<sup>th</sup> century, still stands beside the church. It is no longer used by the bishops and has been converted into private houses.

After the short formal meeting, members of the Hundred Parishes Society explored the excellent small museum, built around the forge which is still used. There was an added bonus as Cristina explained the museum's fascinating Elizabethan wall paintings. They have been there for some 400 years and were hidden beneath several layers of paint until their recent restoration.

There is a surprising number of museums within the Hundred Parishes, covering a whole range of interests and all staffed by enthusiastic people. Most have now closed for the winter, but a few remain open. These are: Imperial War Museum, Duxford, and Saffron Walden Museum are open most days, whilst Linton Zoo, Great Dunmow Maltings Museum and Ashdon Museum have limited hours. #### HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL WARNS AGAINST ROGUE TRADERS

On average, almost 250 reports of rogue trading are made each year in Hertfordshire, but it is estimated that only between five and 20 per cent of these crimes are reported – that's why Hertfordshire County Council's Trading Standards team is advising residents to follow a few top tips:

- 1. Say no to doorstep callers. Do not buy goods or services at the door.
- 2. If you are considering having work done, always shop around first and get at least three quotes.
- 3. You can search for a Hertfordshire Trading Standards Approved Trader on the Which? Trusted Traders website or by calling Trading Standards.
- 4. Honest businesses agree pricing beforehand, including VAT. There's no evidence without a written
- 5. Avoid paying cash in hand. It's better to pay by bank transfer or cheque, as these can be traced.
- 6. If you think you or a vulnerable relative or neighbour has become the victim of a rogue trader, report it straight away.

David Russell, 67, from Ware, contacted a local trader when he had a problem with a drain in his back garden. "From the beginning, the trader didn't seem the least bit friendly. After about an hour he came and he said, 'Well, this is going to cost more than we thought [...] because I need more equipment.' He was there for about five hours altogether, and as time went on seemed to get unhappier."

The trader quoted him £200, but David was charged almost £1,500 – for a job that wasn't done to a satisfactory standard. "I did write a cheque and when I thought about it the next day or so, I thought, well this is really a bit too much, I should take advice on this. I was speaking to friends, and one of them recommended that I go to Trading Standards. I phoned them up and spoke to them and they said, 'Well, the first thing to do is to cancel the cheque.'."

David was lucky as he contacted Trading Standards quickly and was able to cancel his cheque before it was cashed. As the trader had failed to give cancellation rights or indicate VAT-inclusive prices, Trading Standards brought him to court, where he pleaded guilty and was fined a total of £2,400 for David's case and two others. The company he worked for was also fined a total of £5,600.

Richard Thake, Cabinet Member for Community Safety at Hertfordshire County Council, said: "Hertfordshire County Council is committed to keeping residents safe, so we recommend that everybody reads and shares this advice, particularly with vulnerable older relatives and neighbours. If you've been targeted by a rogue trader, don't let them get away with it. Always report anything suspicious to our Trading Standards team."

Russell Reeder, Principal Trading Standards Officer at Hertfordshire County Council, said: "It may be tempting to just find someone in the phone book or say yes to the trader that's just knocked on your door but, as David's story shows, you don't know that you'll be getting a fair price or a good service."

He added, "Our partnership with Which? Trusted Traders helps consumers to find reliable traders who have been thoroughly assessed and checked."


